MONKEYPOX 101: WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW TO LIVWELL



Information is constantly evolving surrounding the Monkeypox virus and vaccine. We want to ensure that our clients have all the information, especially regarding HIV relations. We offer this short guide as a roadmap for those who may not be familiar with Monkeypox symptoms, ways to stay safe, and vaccine information. As the virus develops and more is learned about Monkeypox, it is a good rule to check your local Health Department's website regularly for updates.

What is Monkeypox?

Monkeypox is an illness caused by the Orthopoxvirus, the same virus family that causes the smallpox illness.

Who is contracting Monkeypox, and is it really in Kentucky?

Positive cases have been confirmed in our state and local counties. The illness is commonly spread by skin-to-skin contact and particularly impacts the gay, trans, and bisexual communities. Spread of the illness has also been common in men who have sex with men.

What symptoms should I watch out for?

Itchy, painful bumps or sores in and around your mouth, as well as your arms, hands, legs, and feet. Other symptoms include headache, fever, swollen lymph nodes, and muscle aches.

How can I stay protected from contracting Monkeypox?

- Limit having multiple or anonymous sex partners, as this may increase your risk of exposure.
- Wash your hands often with hot water and soap or use hand sanitizer that is alcohol-based.
- Limit touching your face as much as possible.
- Avoid close, skin-on-skin contact with anyone baring a rash; this includes kissing, hugging, etc.
- · Do not use anything such as bedding, utensils,

or personal items that someone with Monkeypox has been using recently without high-heat, proper sterilization practices.

Where can I get a vaccine?

Vaccines are available but in minimal supply. In partnership with state health departments, the Center for Disease Control recommends that only people with a high risk of exposure seek vaccination at this time. If you feel you meet the criteria outlined below, don't hesitate to contact your local health department to inquire about a vaccination appointment.

Who should be getting the vaccine?

- Men who have sex with men, including those who identify as gay, OR bisexual, OR transgender, OR gender non-conforming, OR gender non-binary who are 18 yrs or older AND
 - o Have had multiple or anonymous male, transgender, or gender non-conforming sex partners in the past 14 days; **OR**
 - o Had a diagnosis of gonorrhea and/or early syphilis within the past 12 months; **OR**
 - o Are on HIV pre-exposure prophylaxis (PrEP)

OR

Persons who attended an event/venue where there
was a high risk of exposure to an individual(s) with
confirmed monkeypox through skin-to-skin or
sexual contact in the last 14 days.

<u>OR</u>

 Individuals who, on a case-by-case basis, are determined to have reasonable suspicion of recent direct skin-to-skin contact to a known or suspected case of monkeypox.
